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Educational Accountability Through the Lens of Elementary School Teachers in Public Sector

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Abstract

The purpose of this survey was to find out how educators felt about their job's educational accountability. The study's major goal was to find out how instructors felt about educational accountability in their jobs. This research was based on job demands-resources models and earlier research findings. A cross-sectional survey was used by the researcher. For quantitative data collection, 375 primary school teachers were selected from the entire population of the districts of Lahore and Kasur using Taro Yamane's formula. For quantitative data collection, proportionate stratified random selection was utilised to pick a sample of 375 respondents from two districts: Lahore and Kasur. Quantitative data was statistically evaluated using descriptive statistics (Mean, ranges, and standard deviation) in SPSS version 15. Teachers had a positive opinion of educational accountability, according to quantitative studies.
